Introducing NIBIN-by-Appointment Service

The Tulsa Police Department Northeast Oklahoma Regional NIBIN Program offers surrounding law enforcement agencies with a highly efficient, streamlined, and simplified process for entering crime-gun evidence into the ATF NIBIN database. This NIBIN-by-appointment service allows law enforcement agencies the opportunity to enter eligible firearm and cartridge case evidence into NIBIN faster than going through the traditional laboratory submission process. As more time passes between evidence collection and NIBIN entry, the usefulness of a NIBIN lead diminishes. This is one factor that motivated TPD to offer this NIBIN-by-appointment service. NIBIN entries are performed on the same day that firearm evidence is brought to the NEOK Regional NIBIN Site, and database searches are completed within two business days. Law enforcement agencies will receive immediate notification via email of any NIBIN leads, which helps investigators connect crime-gun evidence to previously unknown firearms or crime scenes.

NIBIN Eligible Calibers

The following calibers are eligible for NIBIN entry:

- all semiautomatic pistols, including 22 caliber;
- 223 Remington, 5.56x45mm;
- 7.62x39mm, 300 Blackout semiautomatic rifles; and
- long guns that utilize pistol ammunition.

The following are not eligible for NIBIN entry:

- revolvers and derringers;
- single shot or bolt action rifles;
- shotguns; or
- firearms deemed unsafe or inoperable.



NIBIN-by-Appointment Submission Procedure

1. Call or email the NEOK Regional NIBIN Site to receive an appointment form.
2. Complete the appointment form and submit it to [REDACTED]. You will receive a prompt response confirming an agreed-upon appointment time.
3. Prepare evidence for submission according to your agency’s procedures.
4. Bring your evidence to the NEOK Regional NIBIN Site on the scheduled appointment time.
5. Remain onsite while NIBIN entry occurs, and then retrieve your evidence. (Wait times for NIBIN entry are 15 min per cartridge case and 30 min per firearm).
6. You will receive email notifications of any potential NIBIN leads, along with instructions for requesting lead confirmations through the TPD Forensic Lab.
